

The Easter Story

Scripture: Luke 24:1-12 (or John 20:1-18)

Objective:

- Discuss the events of Holy Week in chronological order.
- Discuss the significance of the empty tomb.

Materials: Resurrection eggs (One set per family.)

Lesson:

1. Instruct your grandchild to pick up and open the plastic egg marked #1.
2. Ask your grandchild what is inside?
3. Discuss how this symbol relates to the story of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.
4. Repeat the process with Egg #2 and so on.
5. Note: If you have grandchildren who are unfamiliar with Jesus' death and resurrection, then I recommend that you use these symbols to teach them the story. Have them tell the story back to you when you are finished. If you have grandchildren who are familiar with Jesus' death and resurrection, allow them to tell you what the symbols mean.
6. We want everything we teach about God to be grounded in Scripture. Therefore, I encourage you to end this lesson by reading the Easter story in the Bible.
